## From the Desk of Fr. Jim.....

### THE LAY APOSTOLATE

A crucial part of a living faith is apostolate, bringing Christ to the world. During his public ministry, Jesus proclaimed the coming of God's kingdom throughout Galilee and Judea. Jesus' heart was always moved at the sight of the crowds. They seemed troubled and abandoned like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few, so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest (Mt 9:37)." Today, too, the world cries out for laborers, men and women who will proclaim the gospel of our salvation through Jesus Christ. During his public ministry, Our Lord told his disciples, "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give (Mt 10:8)." Jesus gives us everything—forgiveness of sin, divine adoption, eternal life. But, he now tells us, we must bring this gift to others. This is apostolate, the apostolate of the modern Christian.

Today, Jesus is addressing not only ordained priests and deacons; he addresses all the baptized. Baptism is a call to apostolate. All the baptized are called to be modern apostles. All must bring Christ and the Christian way of life to the world. The world needs zealous lay apostles in our own time to bring the spirit of Christ to the family, to the world of work, culture, and society as a whole.

This was true for the early Church as well. We often hear of great bishops, learned theologians, and other historical figures in the early Church. But we often forget the many unknown Christians, who, in fact, converted the Roman world of their time. They did

not live apart in ghettos, but in the midst of their pagan neighbors. They did not wear peculiar clothes or adopt strange customs to set them apart. No. They spoke the same language, acted in the same ways, and ate the same food as their neighbors. What set them apart was not external things, but the love they showed one another, the decency and moral integrity of their lives.

What was true of the early Church is true today. The world needs dedicated lay apostles. Priests and religious cannot infuse the spirit of Christ in the secular world of economics and culture. Only lay apostles can. "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few." The harvest can be lost, if no one goes out to reap it. God needs joyful, faithful Christians who are effective, simple and faithful to the Church. God needs professionals and business people, homemakers and scientists, teachers and engineers who can bring Christ into the business office, the school, and the home. God needs teachers who are humanly excellent and teach with a Christian outlook, teachers who give time to their students. God needs kids who see in school work, sports, and social activities opportunities for apostolate, bringing others to Christ. God needs parents concerned for the education and faith of their children, who take an active part in school boards, committees, school sports programs, and other school activities. God needs lay apostles in every walk of life.

"Without cost you have received;" our Lord reminds us, "without cost you are to give." Are we ready to respond to his call?
