From the Desk of Fr. Herb.....

OUR YOUTH - THE FUTURE OF OUR CHURCH

In just four weeks, the 20th World Youth Day will be held in Cologne, Germany. This will be the 11th International gathering of young people. The Cologne Cathedral, which is the centerpiece of the city, is the seat of the relics of the Magi. The Cologne Cathedral has been a traditional pilgrimage destination for centuries. The city has 165 churches and is split into east and west banks by the Rhine River and is located in the northwest part of Germany. St. Edith Stein entered a convent in Cologne and there is a statue in the city in her honor. This is surely to be an exciting time for the hundreds of thousands of youth throughout the world who will gather for this event. It will also be a time of excitement for our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI as he makes this pilgrimage to his homeland.

One of the inspiring aspects of the previous World Youth Days was how Pope John Paul the Great related with the youth gathered with him. Seeing the past World Youth Days reported by the news channels, it always brought back the memory of my attendance at the Youth in Concert in 1979 at Madison Square Garden during the first Papal visit of John Paul II to New York. I am certain that Pope Benedict XVI will have that same impact with the youth of the world who will gather with him next month in Cologne.

Our youths are a vital part of our Church for the simple reason that they are the future of the Church. I am continually mindful of this each time I administer the Sacrament of Baptism. I look at our recent college graduates and the dreams they have and the futures that are awaiting them. With their hopes and dreams, I am sure there is anxiety as well. We all face that at times in our lives and usually we overcome any stumbling blocks and continue to succeed and go on with our lives.

Today our Gospel story is about the parable of the sower, "The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest." All of us, young and old, are called to be open to the Holy Spirit to be receptors of the Word and carry that Word with our continuing faith-filled discipleship.

Realizing that I am not the Pope and cannot call the world's youth together, I can call on our own youth of St. Patrick's to come together for a great event. Next Sunday, July 17th, our Youth Group is inviting all 8th Grade students, their families and friends, to a barbecue being held at the field next to the church parking lot from 1:30 to 4:00. The afternoon will be a great time to meet St. Patrick's Youth Group members and other parish youths. There will be food, music and other fun activities. If you're able to stop by and grab a hamburger or hot dog (I will most likely have two of each!) please do so. What a wonderful opportunity to gather for fun on a nice summer afternoon and meet up with other Faith interested people.

Pope John Paul II was a tremendous gift from God to us and the Church was blessed to have him as our spiritual leader for almost twenty-seven years. Last August, when the Holy Father announced that the next World Youth Day would be in Cologne, Germany, he said:

"Dear young people, the Church needs genuine witnesses for the new evangelization: men and women whose lives have been transformed by meeting with Jesus, men and women who are capable of communicating this experience to others."

May the young people of our parish continue to hear God's Word and respond to Him with faith-filled lives.
