## From the Desk of Fr. Herb.....

### John Paul the Great – Beatification Process Begins

A few weeks ago, on June 28, the Church placed Pope John Paul II on the path to possible sainthood during a solemn ceremony at a Roman basilica -- the fastest start to a beatification process in memory for a man many considered a saint long before he died.

Cardinal Camillo Ruini, John Paul's longtime collaborator and his vicar for Rome, presided over the Latin-filled ritual at St. John Lateran basilica. During the ceremony, all the officials involved in the "cause" were taking an oath to keep their work secret and not accept gifts that might corrupt the process.

Pope Benedict XVI announced May 13 that he was waiving the traditional five-year waiting period and allowing the church's saint-making process to begin immediately for the Polish-born John Paul, who died April 2 after nearly 27 years guiding the church.

It was only the second time in recent history that such a waiver had been granted: John Paul himself had placed Mother Teresa on the fast-track for sainthood in 1998, but her cause didn't begin until a year after her death, whereas the late pope's was officially beginning less than three months after he died. In placing John Paul on a fast track, Pope Benedict was responding to the outpouring of calls for him to be canonized -- including chants of "Santo Subito!" or "Sainthood Immediately!" that erupted during John Paul's April 8 funeral Mass.

Church officials have said the process will take its regular course, with the lengthy investigation into the pope's life and writings, interviews with key witnesses and investigation of any possible miracles attributed to his intercession. One miracle must be verified for him to be beatified; a second for him to be made a saint.

John Paul's longtime private secretary, Archbishop Stanislaw Dziwisz, recently appointed as the Archbishop of Krakow, said he hoped Benedict would announce that John Paul had been made a saint when he attends the church's World Youth Day this August in Cologne, Germany. The Archbishop did concede in an interview with the

Polish Press Agency that "the chances of that happening are close to zero." But he added: "The world already canonized John Paul II, we are now only waiting for the final confirmation of this fact."

The Diocese of Rome has made no attempts to hide its desire for the case to proceed, reporting that more than 26,000 people had visited the official Web site for the cause. The address of the Web site is;

Once all the material is gathered, the Diocese of Rome turns the case over to the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints, which appoints commissions to review the case and make a final report to the pope, who must decide if John Paul has lived in a "heroic" way.

If the Vatican then confirms a miracle has occurred after John Paul's death thanks to his intercession, he can be beatified..

There is a prayer for the Intercession of John Paul II while this process is going on;

#### ***O Blessed Trinity***

***We thank You for having graced the Church  
with Pope John Paul II  
and for allowing the tenderness of your Fatherly  
care,  
the glory of the cross of Christ,  
and the splendor of the Holy Spirit,  
to shine through him.  
Trusting fully in Your infinite mercy  
and in the maternal intercession of Mary,  
he has given us a living image of Jesus the  
Good Shepherd,  
and has shown us that holiness  
is the necessary measure of ordinary Christian  
life  
and is the way of achieving eternal communion  
with you.  
Grant us, by his intercession, and according to  
Your will,  
the graces we implore,  
hoping that he will soon be numbered  
among your saints.
