WHAT WAS THAT?....

Two weeks ago, we heard the Proclamation of the Date of Easter on Epiphany sung or read during Mass. The ancient tradition dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow the Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter. Although calendars now give that date of Easter and other feasts of the liturgical year for many year in advance, the Epiphany Proclamation still reminds us of the centrality of the Resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.
