FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Sunday - June 18, 2006



On this Feast when we celebrate the central mystery of our worship of God in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, I thought I should take the time to review the actions we do as He calls us together to respond to His gracious love.

Singing: This is **not** an option and not restricted to those who sing well. The rites call for everyone to sing the Hymns and those parts of the Mass that are meant to be sung.

Confiteor: When the Confiteor (I confess...) is said, all are to strike their breast after the words "through my own fault."

Profession of Faith: During the Profession of Faith, all are to bow for the words "by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary and became man."

After the preparation of the Altar and Gifts, the priest says in these or similar words: "Pray, brethren, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father." When he has finished the sentence, *then* the congregation stands - **NOT WHILE HE IS SPEAKING**. Once the people are standing, then they say: "May the Lord accept..."

The Bishops have asked that we bow before receiving Holy Communion. This may be done while the person in front of you is actually receiving the Host and again when the person in front of you is receiving the Precious Blood. This will permit you to respond "Amen" to the statement "Body (or Blood) of Christ."

If you choose to receive in your hands, please straighten your hand completely so that the host may be placed easily in the palm of your hand. **NEVER TAKE THE HOST WITH YOUR FINGERS**. If you choose to receive on the tongue, please open your mouth wide enough and stick out your tongue far enough that this may be accomplished easily.

The *General Instruction to the Roman Missal (GIRM)* also asks that we bow our heads when:

1. The three persons of the Blessed Trinity are named.
2. The name Jesus is spoken.
3. The name Mary is said in the Eucharistic Prayer.
4. The name of the saint of the day is said in the Eucharistic Prayer, i.e., the name of St. Patrick only on the 17th of March and the name of St. Joseph on the 19th of March.

Incense: Because of allergies, we will not use incense at the 7:45 a.m. Sunday Mass. This will be true except for the actual solemnities; Christmas Day, Easter Sunday, and Pentecost Sunday. The reason for this particular Mass is that it is the first of the day and so there will be nothing in the air before the Mass begins. In addition, when the assembly is incensed, all should bow to the minister after he bows to the assembly, both before and after the incensation.

The Church sees in our common postures, gestures, and actions both a symbol of the unity of those who have come together and a means of fostering that unity. When we unite ourselves in common action, we give unambiguous witness that we are indeed the Body of Christ, united in heart, mind, and spirit.
