



LENT 2018



By the threefold discipline of **fasting**, **prayer**, and **almsgiving** the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. All of the faithful and the catechumens should undertake serious practice of these three traditions. (Last week's Bulletin contained information about **fasting** – and is available on the Parish website.)

Stations of the Cross

Fridays, 7:30 P.M. Every Friday during Lent including Good Friday – Main Church

Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession)

Monday - Friday: immediately following 7:00 A.M. Mass and 8:30 A.M.
Saturdays: immediately following 9:00 A.M. Mass and 4:00 - 5:00 P.M.
At other times, please call the Rectory.

Archdiocesan Day for Confessions

March 26 – the Monday of Holy Week – 3:00 until 9:00 P.M.
All Parishes of the Archdiocese will have the Sacrament of Reconciliation available.

March 28 – the Wednesday of Holy Week – 12:30 P.M. and 4:00 until 6:00 P.M.
